## General Guideline for Dress Code

A determination of a dress code violation is based on its effect on the learning environment. If a student’s dress disrupts teaching and learning, it may be designated as a violation.



Halter tops, low cut or strapless tops, exposed midriffs and backs, spaghetti straps, see through clothing are not permitted.

Athletic jerseys must have a t-shirt underneath. Sleeveless shirts are not permitted.



Pajamas, sleepwear, slippers and blankets are not permitted at any time.

All shorts and skirts must be not shorter than fingertip length. Slits in skirts cannot be above the fingertip.

If wearing leggings/yoga pants/stretch skirts, the student’s shirt must be finger length.



Undergarments shall not be visible or exposed for males or females. The waistline of all pants, shorts and skirts must be on or above the hips with no underwear showing. Holes in clothing above fingertip length that show skin are prohibited.



Caps, hats, scarves and hoods are not permitted in the building, except on designated days. There are religious exemptions to this rule.
