Important information

All AP in-person paper and pencil exams will take place at Shiloh High School. All students must wear a mask while testing. We will be following CDC guidelines. Students must bring their own #2 pencil(s) and a blue or black pen. Due to the pandemic we will be using multiple room locations. The exams and rooms they will be held in are listed below:

New Gym:

Calculus AB and BC, Human Geography, and English Literature.

Old Field House:

US Government, Physics C, US History, Art History World History, Macroeconomics, Biology and Environmental Science

A6:

Spanish Language and Culture

Old Gym:

English Language

If a student is late for an exam, whether in person or digital, the student will not be allowed to take the exam per College Board regulations.

Digital Students taking In-Person Paper Exams:

Students taking a morning exam should be dropped off no later than 7:15AM in the bus lane and can be picked up at approximately 11:30 AM in the bus lane. Students taking an afternoon exam should be dropped off no later than 11:15 AM in the bus lane and can be picked up at approximately 3:30 PM in the bus lane. The length of time differs for each exam. If transportation is an issue, digital students may come to school and follow their class schedule before or after their exam. Please note afternoon exams finish after the busses leave, please arrange transportation as needed.

In-Person students:

Students taking a morning exam should be dropped off no later than 7:15AM. Students taking an afternoon exam should be dropped off no later than 11:15 AM. AP students who wish to leave the school early or check-in late for their AP test/s must return the bottom portion of this letter signed by his/her parent or guardian, regardless of their age, back to Ms. Lowell in the STEM Office, B43. You will need to check-in or check out through the E Hall Kiosk. **If no form is returned students will not be allowed to check themselves out. If your student leaves without checking out it will be counted as an AWOL.**

Items to bring to each Exam:

1. **A Photo ID- Driver's License or School ID - Students MUST HAVE a valid photo ID**
2. **Face Mask**
3. **Several sharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers**
4. **Pens with black or dark blue ink**
5. Your six digit school code **111846**
6. A calculator if you are taking the AP Biology, Calculus AB or BC, or Physics Exam. Students may bring up to two graphing calculators. Calculators must be on approved list from College Board.
7. A ruler or straightedge if you are taking the AP Physics Exam
8. Your social security number (optional)

What NOT to bring to the exam:

1. Cell phones, PDA's, BlackBerry smart phones/watches, Bluetooth- enabled devices, MP3 players, email/messaging devices, and any other electronic or communication devices
2. Books, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, colored pencils, compasses
3. Scratch paper/notes
4. Watches that beep or have an alarm or smartwatches
5. Portable listening or recording devices or ear plugs
6. Computer
7. Reference guides
8. Clipboards
9. Clothing with subject related info
10. Food or drink (If students are taking 2 exams on the same day, please feel free to bring a snack/lunch to eat between exams).
