- Food and Clothing Assistance: Agency can provide food or clothing for an individual or family, living in our service area, a maximum of six times in a calendar year. There must be a minimum of 30 days between visits for food and clothing.

- In addition to basic food items, we may be able to honor special requests (only when they are available) for **Baby Products, Household Items, and Personal Care Items.**

Documents needed for services:

- Photo ID for all adults in the household, ID's for each child in the household (including Social Security card, Medicaid cards, etc.), current proof of residency (ex. lease or utility bill)

- Food Assistance: You may visit the Co-op every 30 days to receive food and non-food household items. If you receive food stamps, you may still qualify for non-food household items. You may return to the Co-op every 7 days to receive bread and pastry items.

Documents needed for services:

- We serve residents of Gwinnett County, Georgia living in Grayson, Snellville, and Loganville, you must have a picture id, you must have a piece of US Postal mail addressed to yourself that was received within the last 30 days of your visit to the Co-op. Must be original. Copies are not accepted.

- To receive assistance from us you must attend our First Time Guest Orientation. Orientations will be Monday, Wednesday, Thursday at 10am; Tuesday at 10am OR 6pm. There are no orientations on Fridays. You must arrive 5 minutes before it begins.
- Please expect to be here at least an hour. After you attend orientation you will become a member & get assistance same day. You will then be able to come back weekly.

Documents needed for services:

- Bring your picture ID, proof of income (check stub, food stamp letter, child support etc.), and if you have children who need diapers bring a copy of their birth certificate.
