## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Each semester, 70% of GIVE Center West students will show percentage growth gains that meet or exceed the GCPS average growth gains on District Assessments in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies in 2021-2022; 75% in 2022-2023; 80% in 2023-2024.

- **Annual Goal**

Each semester, 70% of GIVE Center West students will show percentage growth gains that meet or exceed the GCPS average growth gains on District Assessments in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

- **Long Term Goal**

In order to increase the students' cohort graduation rate, 70% of full-time students in grades 6th-12th will earn an average of 3.0 credits per semester in 2021-2022. (Note: Middle school first semester classes will be converted to a 1/2 credit for calculation purposes); 76% in 2022-2023; 80% in 2023-2024.

- **Annual Goal**

In order to increase the students' cohort graduation rate, 70% of full-time students in grades, 6th-12th will earn an average of 3.0 credits per semester in 2021-2022. (Note: Middle school first semester classes will be converted to a 1/2 credit for calculation purposes);

- **Long Term Goal**

GIVE West will decrease the percentage of students who return to a disciplinary panel to 5.5% in 2021-2022; 5.0% in 2022-2023; 4.8% in 2023-2024.

- **Annual Goal**

GIVE West will decrease the percentage of students who return to a disciplinary panel to 5.5% in 2021-2022

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.
