## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Central Gwinnett High School will demonstrate measureable gains in student achievement through reflective and collaborative teaching to ensure that all students graduate on time with opportunities to continue postsecondary education and/or enter the work force.

- o **Annual Goal**

Central Gwinnett High School will improve student achievement across all departments as evidenced by a 10% increase in proficiency on all district and state assessments. CGHS will use a specific framework to grow and monitor CLTs throughout the building with emphasis on intentional formative and summative data analysis practices, demonstration of research-based best practices, and high-yield literacy practices in the areas of classroom culture, instructional planning and instructional strategies.

- o **Annual Goal**

Through the continued implementation of College and Career Academies, including a Ninth Grade Academy and alongside the strategic goals of the Parent Instructional Support Center, Central Gwinnett will decrease the 9th grade retention rate by 5% from the 2020-2021 school year and improve the four year graduation cohort rate by 5% with targeted efforts to increase the graduation rate of Special Education students.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.
