Local School Plan for Improvement

Mountain View High School

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Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. • Long Term Goal

Mountain View High School will establish a K-12 standard for rigor resulting in increased participation in and successful completion of accelerated courses including AP and Dual Enrollment courses. Mountain View High School will increase the number of students attempting the AP exam to 1000, the number of tests taken to 1800, and the percentage of students scoring 3, 4 or 5 to 78% by the 2023-2024 school year. Mountain View will continue to increase the number of students participating in and successfully completing Dual Enrollment courses.

o Annual Goal

Through Advanced Placement (AP) opportunities, Mountain View High School will increase college credit opportunities for students by improving the percentage of students scoring 3 or higher on AP exams to 79% for the 2021-2022 school year, the number of students attempting AP exams to 600, and the number of exams taken to 1200 in 2021-2022.

o Annual Goal

Through Dual Enrollment (DE) opportunities, MVHS will sustain the total number of dual enrollment students to at least 300 and the college credits earned through dual enrollment for the 2021-2022 school year to 10 credits on average.

• Long Term Goal

Mountain View High School will improve student achievement across the curriculum for students in all subgroups. Specifically, MVHS will focus on economically disadvantaged subgroups in Math and Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

o Annual Goal

Mountain View High School will improve student achievement and literacy for all students to meet and/or exceed baseline targets on the district Gateway writing assessment and the Georgia Milestone Assessment. Specifically for Gateway, MVHS will reduce the percentage of Does Not Meet from 16% to 10% in Science. We will reduce the percentage of Does Not Meet from 9% to 7% in Social Studies. Last, MVHS will increase its percentage of distinguished and proficient learners by 5% in all EOC content areas.

• Long Term Goal

Mountain View High School students will be successful according to all indicators of the CCRPI. MVHS's CCRPI score will improve to 94 with a graduation rate increase to 95% by the 2023-2024 school year.

o Annual Goal

Mountain View High School will increase its 4-year graduation rate to 93% by 2021-2022 through the implementation of our 9th grade academy, credit recovery, the district's multi year acceleration plan and by ensuring equity and enrichment for all students.

o Annual Goal

Mountain View High School will increase its CCRPI score to 85 for the 2021-2022 school year.
