Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. #### • Long Term Goal

Sugar Hill Elementary students will leave elementary school mastering local, state and national mathematical standards. 100% of students will score in the Proficient or Distinguished range and at least 30% in the Distinguished learner category on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for Mathematics by the 2025 School Year. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in middle school and in the college and career of their choice.

#### o Annual Goal

During the 2021-22 school year, all students will score 70% or better on Math District Assessments. In addition, the number of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on the Georgia Milestones will increase by 5% from the prior Milestones.

3rd Grade will increase to 57.8% from 52.8%

4th grade will increase to 69.4% from 64.4%

5th grade will increase to 53.7% from 48.7%

#### • Long Term Goal

Sugar Hill Elementary students will leave elementary school with the ability to meet and exceed local, state, and national literacy standards in order to effectively communicate and understand oral and written text. 100% of students will score in the Proficient or Distinguished Learner range and 30% in the Distinguished category on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/Language Arts by the 2025 School Year. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in middle school and in the college and career of their choice.

#### o Annual Goal

During the 2021-22 school year, all students will score 70% or better on the Language Arts District Assessments. In addition, the number of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished on the Georgia Milestones will increase by 5% from the prior school year.

3rd Grade will increase to 55.9% from 50.9%

4th grade will increase to 66.9% from 61.9%

5th grade will increase to 63.3% from 58.3%

#### o Annual Goal

During the 2021-2022 school year, all students will score 70% or better on the Social Studies District Assessments.

#### • Long Term Goal

Sugar Hill Elementary students will leave elementary school with the ability to meet and exceed local, state, and national science standards. 100% of students will score in the Proficient or Distinguished Learner range and 30% in the Distinguished category on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for science by the 2025 School Year. Students will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in middle school and in the college and career of their choice.

#### o Annual Goal
