## Local School Plan for Improvement

Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Trickum Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the “proficient” and “distinguished” performance levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessment for English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies to 100% by spring 2025.

- o **Annual Goal**

Students at Trickum Middle School will succeed on the end of year Georgia Milestones (if applicable) as evidenced by the following:

Language Arts: 60% Proficient and Distinguished with 22% being distinguished

Mathematics: 58% at Proficient and Distinguished with 22% being distinguished

Science: 60% at Proficient and Distinguished with 26% being distinguished

Social Studies: 66% at Proficient and Distinguished with 31% being distinguished

- o **Annual Goal**

Trickum Middle School's CCRPI score will be in the top 25% of Georgia middle schools in 2021-2022.

- **Long Term Goal**

Trickum Middle School will increase the percentage of students meeting typical or high growth as measured in the Progress section of the College and Career Readiness Performance Index to 100% by spring 2025.

- o **Annual Goal**

All Trickum Middle School content areas will, by the end of the 2021-2022 school year, have all students in all content areas score 75% or higher on locally created common assessments.
