DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM?



The Dual Enrollment Program is an opportunity for qualified high school students to earn college credits paid for by the state of Georgia, including a book allowance or free book usage (depending on the institution). Some programs may require fees (program fees) that are not part of the Dual Enrollment funding.

The student is “jointly” enrolled in high school and in college. Students can be a full time or part time college student in Fall, Spring, or even Summer semester.

The student earns college credits as well as high school credits needed for graduation.

WHERE CAN I ATTEND?

A student may apply
to attend any
participating public
college, private
college, or technical
college in Georgia.





WHAT ARE THE PROS AND CONS?

PROS

- Students can get a head start on college.
- Helps students adjust to the college experience.
- Students may take classes not available at the high school.
- Earning College credits saves money on future college coursework—earlier graduation from college (not high school).

CONS

- Students must keep up with important Junior/Senior High School information. School websites are VITAL sources of information.
- Many colleges prefer a different curriculum path (i.e. AP classes).
- Colleges will not “usually” communicate with parents of Dual Enrollment students.

HB 444 DUAL ENROLLMENT ACT!!

Limiting Dual Enrollment “core course work” to Juniors and Seniors

Allowing 10th grade students to participate **ONLY** in CTAE area coursework.

Limiting Dual Enrollment students to a maximum of 30 hours of post-secondary coursework.

9th Grade students are NOT eligible.

WHAT ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT?

- It is the student's responsibility to talk with colleges regarding their policies on Dual Enrollment credit. Generally, public colleges in the state of Georgia will honor any credit earned at any other Georgia public college when a grade of "C" or better is earned.
- Private colleges and out of state colleges vary on their acceptance of Dual Enrollment credit.

HOW DOES GRADING WORK?

- ✓ If colleges provide the high school with letter grades, the high school will transcribe the letter grade to the midpoint of the grading scale (unless grading scale is provided).

A = 95 B = 85 C = 75

D = 72 F = 55

- ✓ Students may NOT drop a class without penalty*****

- ✓ If the student fails a class, it could jeopardize graduation and future Dual Enrollment status!

- ✓ No points are added to the final grade (exception – 10 pts. are added to Georgia Tech – Calculus II).

- ✓ All Dual Enrollment funded classes are included on the high school transcript.



CREDIT CONVERSION

▶ 1 - 2 semester hour college classes =
.5 HS credit.

▶ 3 - 5 semester hour college classes =
1.0 HS credit.

Note: Science labs will receive a grade, but NO credit on transcript. They will not count toward fourth science requirement.

Student's total schedule (MHSHS + College) must total at least 3.0 units per semester worth of credit.

BE AWARE!!!

- ✓ A student must meet the entrance requirements of the college.
- ✓ It is the student's responsibility to register for the correct classes.
- ✓ If a student registers for a Dual Enrollment course they previously failed, they will receive a bill from the college. Dual Enrollment will not pay for the course.
 - ✓ Students will also be required to self-pay if they have already met the 30-hour max.
- ✓ The student is responsible for ALL interaction with the college. The college will not speak with a parent or the High School Coordinator regarding the student.
- ✓ Students must have all schedule changes approved by the High School Coordinator.
- ✓ Holidays such as Spring Break will be different from the Gwinnett County holidays.

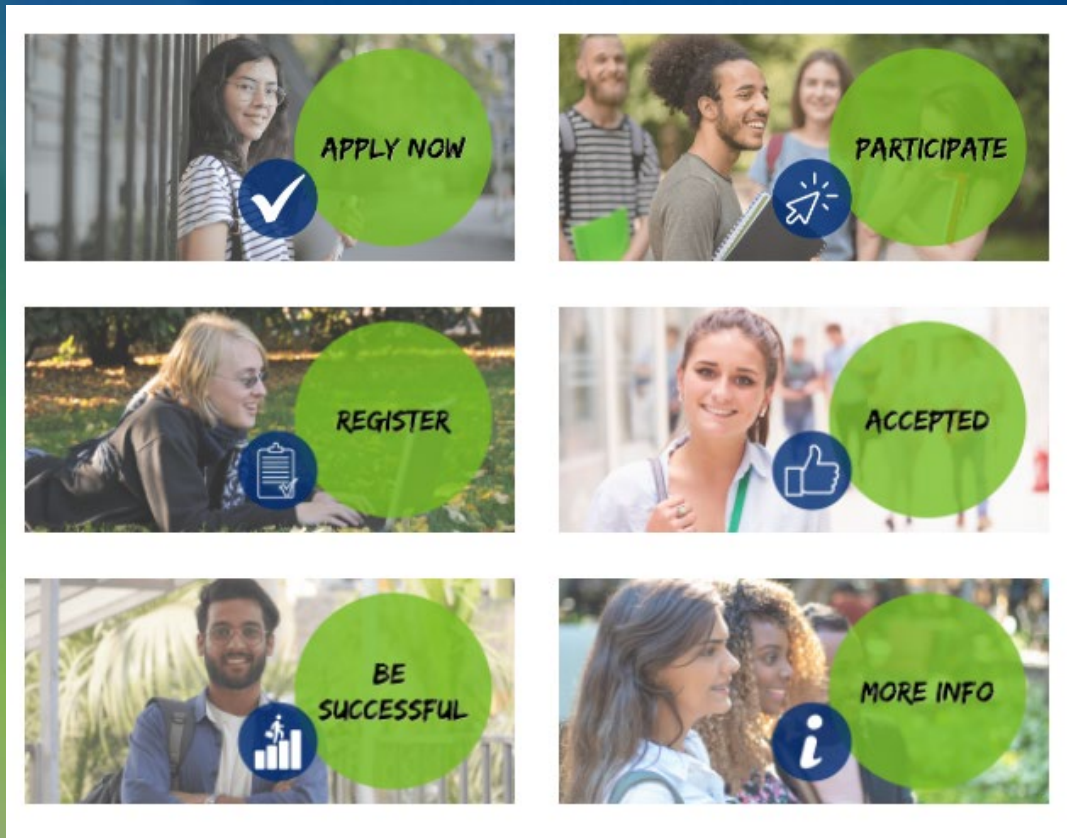

What is Dual Enrollment (DE)?

- Dual Enrollment is a program that allows high school students to take college courses and earn college credit, while satisfying high school graduation requirements at the same time.
- Students can receive up to 30 hours of Dual Enrollment Funding which covers 100% of Tuition, Regular Fees, and Books for approved courses!

Who Can Be a Dual Enrollment Student?

- 10th, 11th, or 12th grader at an eligible public, private, or homeschool program
- Attend a high school in Georgia
- Submit all required college admission items by the college deadlines – requirements on our website



What Courses Can You Take?

- Core (Math, History, English, Psychology, etc)
DE funding available for 11th and 12th graders
- CTAE (Auto, Welding, Marketing, Business, etc)
DE funding available for 10th, 11th and 12th
graders

SAVE MONEY

- Dual Enrollment funding covers tuition, fees and books for 30 credits of eligible course work (about 10 college courses)
- Does not impact HOPE hours

What's Next?

1. Meet with your high school counselor
2. Complete Gwinnett Technical College Application (Select Dual Enrollment as the student type)
3. Complete GAFutures.org Funding Application and Student Participation Agreement Form (*Student & Parent Approval Required*)
4. Submit Tuition Acknowledgement Form
5. Submit Qualifying Test Scores or GPA

* Once ALL required items are submitted, students are accepted and able to register!

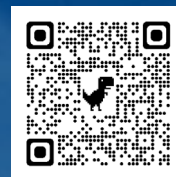
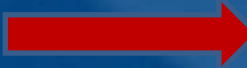

Submit Application and all supporting information to GGC.

- ▶ GPA Requirement – 3.25
- ▶ SAT Minimum – 1050 Tot/ Math
510/500 ERW
- ▶ ACT Minimum – Composite 20;
Math 20, English 21
- ▶ ACCUPLACER – Reading 237;
Writerplacer 4; Quantitative
Reasoning Algebra and Statistics 266

Application Deadlines:

November 2nd (Spring), April 1st (Summer),
May 3rd (Fall)

Junior or Senior Year
ONLY and 16* years old

REQUIREMENTS FOR

GEORGIA STATE: PERIMETER COLLEGE

Submit Application and all supporting information to GPC.

- GPA Requirement: 3.0
- SAT: 530 Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, 530 Math
- ACT: 20 English or Reading, 21 Math
 - ACCUPLACER: 237 Nex-Gen Reading, 258 Nex-Gen QAS (Math), Writeplacer 4-8
 - Age/Grade Level Requirement: Successful completion of 10th grade is required.

Application Deadlines:

November 1st (Spring); April 1st (Summer);
May 1st (Fall)

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

THE FOLLOWING STEPS SHOULD BE FOLLOWED
IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM:

- X 1. Attend Dual Enrollment Information Meeting/View Dual Enrollment Presentation.
- ___ 2. Complete the Advisement and Contact Information Form.
- ___ 3. Apply to the college/university of your choice. Keep in mind that different schools have different admissions procedures. *
- ___ 4. Create a GaFutures.org account and complete an electronic Dual Enrollment Funding application and Participation Form (student/parent). One time per academic year. NOTIFY YOUR COUNSELOR WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED

*Repeat Each Semester of participation (excluding GTC - once per year)



PROCEDURES CONT.

- ___5. Meet with your college advisor and select classes. Obtain a copy of your college schedule. *

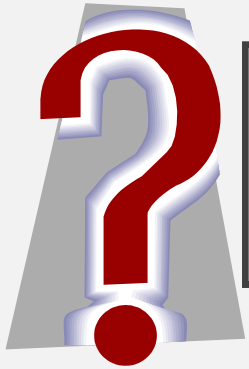
- ___6. Provide Dr. Myers with a copy of your schedule. If necessary, Dr. Myers will adjust your MSHHS schedule to coincide with your college schedule. *

- ___7. MSHHS completes the GA FUTURES funding application AFTER receiving the schedule from the student.

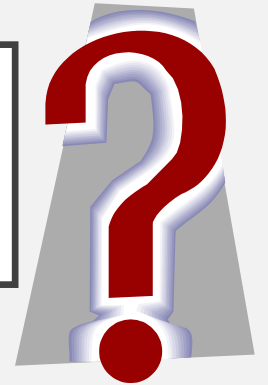
- ___8. During this process, you may get emails from the Bursar's Office indicating that payment is due---be patient!

- ___9. At the end of the semester, provide a copy of your college/university grades and an official transcript to your High School Coordinator in a timely manner.

***Repeat Each Semester of participation.**
