Overview:	Students may enroll in entry level fine arts classes in dance, music, theatre, or visual art.	Students may complete a Fine Arts Pathway in Dance, Music, Theatre, or Visual Art by taking a series of 3 full credits in one fine arts subject area. Students who complete fine arts pathways are eligible to earn a Fine Arts Diploma Seal from the Georgia Department of Education (additional requirements apply.)	The Conservatory program is an audition and portfolio based program open to students from CGHS and across the district. Students in this signature program will engage extensively with professionals in the industry and will be uniquely prepared for college and career options in the industry.
Admission Requirements:	Any student enrolled at Central Gwinnett High School.	Any student enrolled at Central Gwinnett High School.	Students must submit an application, audition/interview in desired discipline(s), and submit 2 letters of recommendation; students must meet eligibility requirements for permissive transfer.
Criteria:	Any student enrolled at Central Gwinnett High School with an interest in learning more about the fine arts.	Any student enrolled at CGHS with an interest in a specific area of focus; promotion is based on teacher recommendation and yearly juried performances and portfolio reviews. Students from outside of the Central Cluster may apply to enroll as a Fellows student. *Students must retain permissive transfer eligibility to remain enrolled at SOTA @ CGHS.	Once admitted via audition/interview, students must maintain a B average in all fine arts courses; promotion is based on teacher recommendation and yearly juried performances and portfolio reviews.*Students must retain permissive transfer eligibility to remain enrolled at SOTA @ CGHS.
