What is Title I?

The Title I Program:

- Is the largest federal assistance program for schools.
- Provides support to students who are at risk of not meeting the State's academic standards.
- Determines funding by the number of students receiving free or reduced lunch.
- Supports parents/families by offering activities and training opportunities to increase engagement in their children's education.

What is Title I?

Two types of Title I programs:

- Targeted Assistance:
 No schools in GCPS participate in TAS
- Schoolwide:68 schools participate in GCPS

What is Title I?

Schoolwide Program

- All students at the school benefit from Title I funds.
- Materials, equipment, technology, professional development, extended learning time, salaries of some teachers, and the Parent Center are some of the possible items funded through Title I



What are our school goals?

- The percentage of students in Kindergarten through fifth grade scoring at the proficient or distinguished categories in English Language Arts will be at the district level.
- The percentage of students in Kindergarten through fifth grade scoring at the proficient or distinguished categories in Mathematics will be at the district level.

How can you support us in reaching our school goals?

What Are Our Students Learning This Year?

AKS Resources - Academic Knowledge and Skills - Gwinnett
County's curriculum is based on the Math and Language Arts Georgia
Standards of Excellence and Georgia Performance Standards

What tests will our students take this year?

National, state, district, and local school tests

- ACCESS (Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State to State) measures English Language Learners' social and academic language proficiency
- CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) measures the way students think
- GKIDS (Georgia Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills)
- IOWA measures student progress in Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies
- District Assessments formative assessments that inform teachers' instructional practices
- GMAS EOG Spring (Georgia Milestones End of Grade) a summative assessment that measures how well students have mastered the grade level standards in Language Arts, Math, and Science (Grade 5 only)

How are we providing additional academic support?

- Early Intervention Program (EIP) Classworks, Education Galaxy, Reading Recovery, Amplify, and iREADY
- English Learners (EL) Imagine Learning, EL certified teachers, an additional EL certified teacher who provides language support services to some EL students
- Special Education (SpEd) Specialized instruction to meet the individualized needs of the student
- Saturday Intervention Program Sessions will be available in the fall and in the spring

How can you provide input in your child's school?

- Attend Title I Planning Meeting (once a year in spring)
 - Provide input into School Goals
 - Provide input into Title I budget
 - Jointly develop the School-Family Plan & Promise
- Review Draft Documents after Title I Planning Meeting
- Be present at Parent-Teacher Conferences
- Be present at Student Support Team (SST) meetings when invited
- Join and participate in PTA
- Local School Council
- Parent Advisory committee

• In addition, parents will be notified by the school when their child has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.




How will GCPS use Title I funds?
