- **57.1% of graduates are college and career ready.**

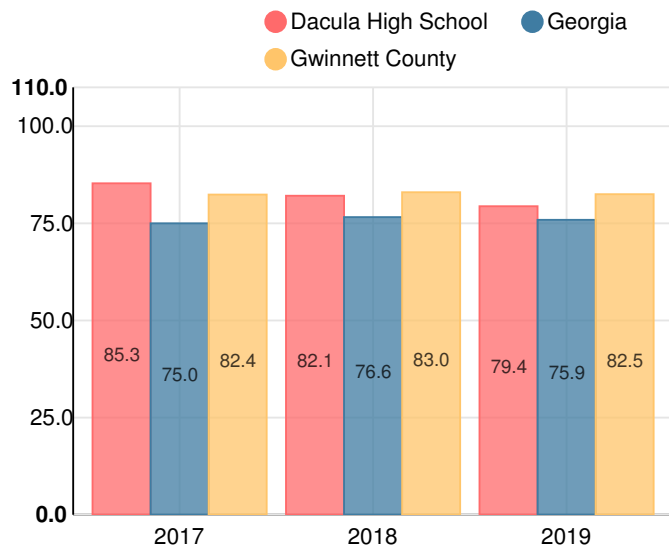

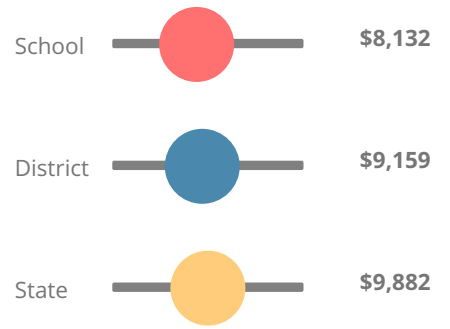

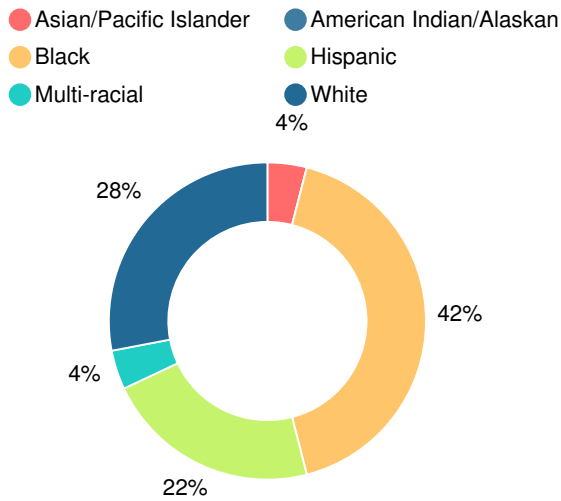
Financial Efficiency Star Rating



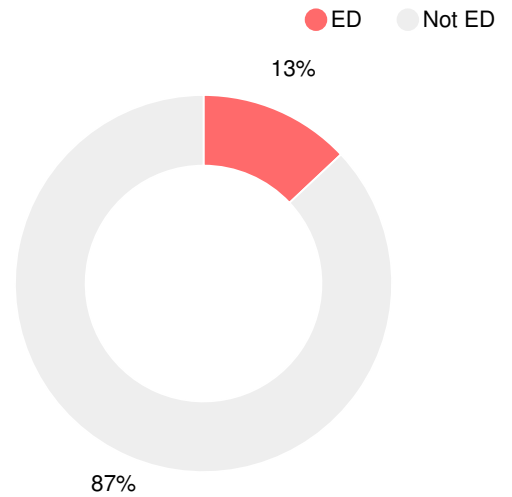
Per Pupil Expenditures



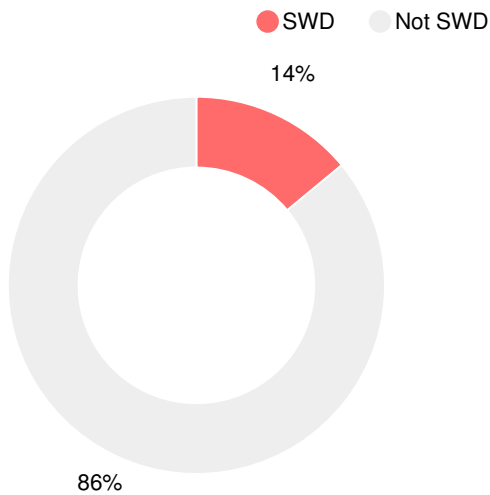

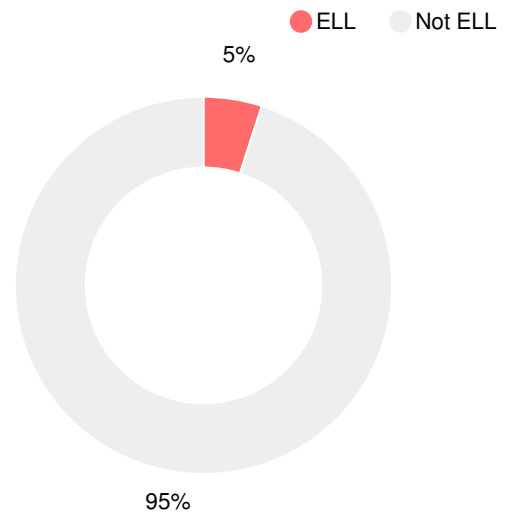

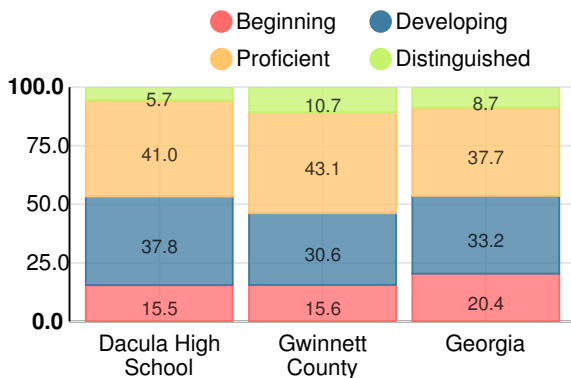

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2019

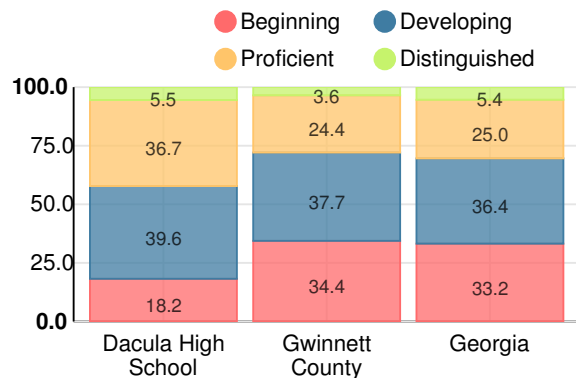

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2019

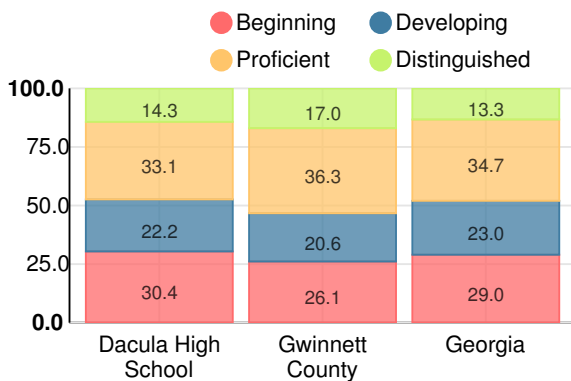

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2019

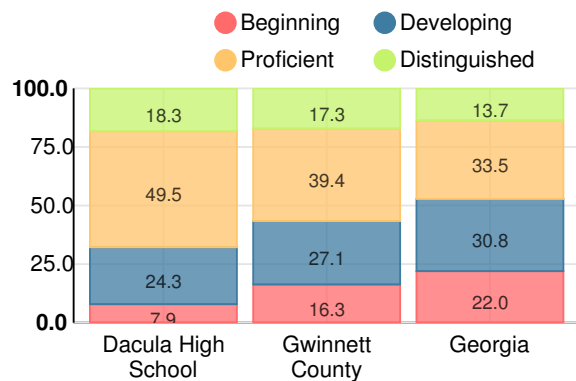

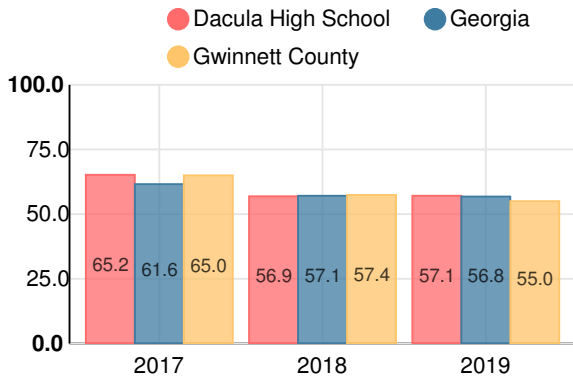
Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2019

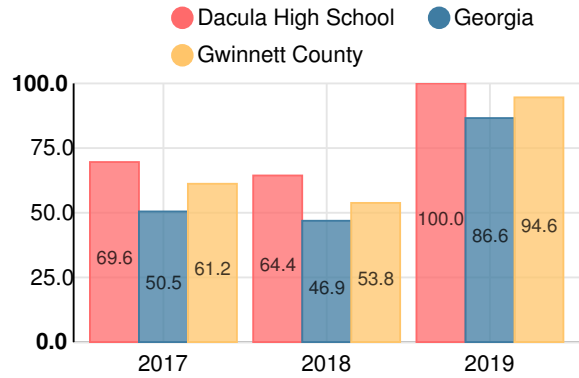
College & Career Readiness

Percent of 12th grade students who are college and career ready

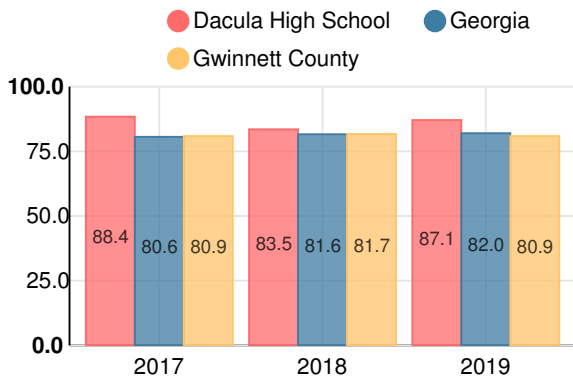


Accelerated Course Taking
