



Georgia Driver's License: When You Can Apply

Age	Type of License	Prerequisites
14 (First Timers)	Instructional Permit	Your parent or guardian must be visually impaired. You must be enrolled in or have graduated from secondary school. Also pass a Knowledge Exam and a Vision Test.
15 (First Timers)	Instructional Permit	You must be enrolled in or have graduated from secondary school. Also pass a Knowledge Exam and a Vision Test.
16+ (Instructional Permit Holders)	Provisional License	Must have held Instructional Permit for one year. You must once again show that you are enrolled in or have graduated from secondary school. Also complete an ADAP class and a Driver's Ed course, practice driving for 40 hours (6 hours at night), and pass a Vision Test and a Road Test.
18+ (First Timers)	Full (Adult) License	You must practice driving for 40 hours (6 hours at night). Also pass a Knowledge Exam, a Vision Test, and a Road Test.
18+ (Instructional Permit Holders)	Full (Adult) License	If you obtained your Instructional Permit when you were under 18, you must practice driving for 40 hours (6 hours at night). Also pass a Vision Test and a Road Test.
18+ (Provisional License Holders)	Full (Adult) License	None.

Note 1: Georgia requires all aspiring drivers under 18 to complete an [Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program](#) (ADAP) class.

Note 2: To apply for any type of instruction permit or license, you must first obtain consent from your parents or guardians if you are under 18 years of age.

Note 3: If more than one line of this table applies to you, you can choose either option unless otherwise specified.
