



SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2021-2022

Brookwood High School has once again been recognized by *U. S. News & World Report* as a top-ranking high school in the nation. It was also named an AP Honor School in five categories by the Georgia Department of Education: School of Distinction, STEM, STEM Achievement, Humanities, and Humanities Achievement.

ACADEMICS

- The Class of 2021 had 886 graduates, including 275 AP Scholars, 19 Dual Enrollment Scholars, 364 Honor Graduates, and 161 top seniors graduating with a 4.0 GPA. Brookwood had 4 Georgia Scholars, and 52 National Honor Society graduates who held a 95% three-year cumulative GPA, demonstrated leadership, and performed service hours.
- Brookwood Science Olympiad won the state championship with eight first-place medaling events, and eight in second, three in third, and one in fourth. This impressive finish is the team's 10th win in the past 11 state tournaments, following its nine-year winning streak, 2011-2019. It placed 16th at Nationals, earning nine top-10 finishes.
- Brookwood Robotics qualified for the World VEX Competition in Dallas.
- A Brookwood Technology Student Association (TSA) team placed first in the TSA TEAMS (Tests of Engineering Aptitude, Mathematics, and Science) state competition. Brookwood had four teams compete, and all four ranked in Georgia's top 10.
- The Governor's Honor Program accepted 14 Brookwood students for Summer 2022.
- A Brookwood German student was the first in GCPS to take and pass the second level German language certificate, deeming him fluent in German and entitling him to a free education at a top university in Germany.

ATHLETICS

- Brookwood's Class of 2022 had 29 varsity athletes sign college team commitments.
- State Champions: This was the first year Brookwood had an Esports team, and its Super Smash Bros. Ultimate team won the state championship.
- County Champions: Girls Swim and Dive (eighth consecutive), Girls Track and Field (sixth in 10 years).
- Region Champions: Volleyball, Boys Cross Country, Girls Cross Country, Football, Girls Flag Football (area), Duals Wrestling (6th consecutive), Traditional Wrestling (6th consecutive), Girls Basketball (back-to-back), Cheerleading, Boys Tennis, Girls Tennis, Girls Soccer, Boys Soccer, Girls Track and Field, and Boys Track and Field.
- Five Region Coaches of the Year: Volleyball (Stacey Bennum), Girls Basketball (Courtney Mincy), Boys Soccer (Adel Mohsen), Girls Soccer (Michael Tolmich), Baseball (Titus Martin)

FINE ARTS

- Brookwood's Class of 2022 had 31 graduates who planned to declare a fine arts major or minor at the college level.
- Theater: At the Region One-Act Play Competition, Brookwood placed first for the fourth consecutive year and won the Best Crew Award.
- Brookwood Marching Band was chosen to perform at the January 2, 2023 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, Calif.
- Brookwood alumnus Joe Gebbia established an endowment for the school with a \$500,000 donation to support the visual arts program.
- Brookwood High School photography students earned 14 awards at the GCPS Shutter Sense Photography Competition.
- Three visual arts students were among only 100 chosen from 1,600 submissions to display their work at the annual All-State Art Symposium.
- Broncos were accepted to each All-State performing arts categories: Band (3), Chorus (13), Music Technology (4), Orchestra (1), and Theatre (2).

PHILANTHROPY

- Brookwood raised \$158,096 for charity. Since September 2014, when Brookwood launched the M1M March to \$1 Million campaign to raise \$1 million for charity by September 2025, it has raised \$930,836.
