Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. • Long Term Goal

K-5 students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in reading comprehension and writing. 90% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will score in the Proficient and Distinguished Learner range and at least 30% will score in the Distinguished Learner range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System.

o Annual Goal

LSPI ELA/Reading Goal:

During the 2020-2021 school year, K-5 students will demonstrate an increase in their reading comprehension, reading fluency, and writing.

ES students will demonstrate effective reading comprehension skills and fluency by scoring on or above expected levels of performance/growth on Gwinnett County Public Schools' (GCPS) Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on ELA Unit Assessments.

• Long Term Goal

K-5 students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical concepts. 90% of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade will score in the Proficient and Distinguished Learners range and at least 30% will score in the Distinguished Learners range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System.

o Annual Goal

LSPI Math Goal:

During the 2020-2021 school year, K-5 students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate an increase in their mastery of mathematical concepts.

ES students will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical computation skills and problem solving abilities by scoring on or above their expected levels of performance/growth on the Gwinnett County Public Schools District (GCPS) Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on Math Unit Assessments.

• Long Term Goal

K-5 students at Burnette Elementary will develop a deeper knowledge and understanding of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) concepts and processes required for personal decision making, participation in civic and cultural affairs, and economic productivity. 75% of 5th grade students will score in the Proficient and Distinguished Learners range and at least 20% will score in the Distinguished Learners range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System in Science.

o Annual Goal

LSPI Science Goal:

During the 2020-2021 school year, 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in science skills and content by scoring on or above their expected levels of performance/growth on the Gwinnett County Public Schools District (GCPS) Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on Science Unit Assessments.



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- **Long Term Goal**

K-5 students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in Social Studies. 75% of 5th grade students will score in the Proficient and Distinguished Learners range and at least 20% will score in the Distinguished Learners range on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System.

LSPI Social Studies Goal:

During the 2020-2021 school year, 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students at Burnette Elementary will demonstrate proficiency in Social Studies skills and content by scoring on or above their expected levels of performance/growth on the Gwinnett County Public Schools District (GCPS) Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on Social Studies Unit Assessments.
