Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

80% of students at Dyer ES will perform in the Proficient/Distinguished range on the Math GMAS subtests. A minimum of 30% percent of students will perform in the Distinguished range by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

Dyer Elementary students will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical computation skills and problem solving abilities by scoring on or above their expected levels of performance on the GCPS Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on Math Unit Assessments.

- **Long Term Goal**

80% percent of students at Dyer ES will perform in the Proficient/Distinguished range on the English/Language Arts GMAS subtests. A minimum of 30% percent of students will perform in the Distinguished range by 2020-2021.

- o **Annual Goal**

Dyer Elementary students will demonstrate effective reading comprehension skills by scoring on or above expected levels of performance on GCPS Unit Assessments. All students will score a 70% or above on ELA Unit Assessments.
