Accountability and flexibility are hallmarks of Gwinnett County Public Schools' success. Key to that success is ensuring that each school community understands the progress being made by its schools, as well as what plans will drive improvement. Each school creates a collaborative Local School Plan for Improvement (LSPI), with targeted goals based on student achievement results. These goals are dynamic, like our schools, and are updated to reflect changes that occur in schools. Data is used to determine areas needing improvement and to identify specific, measurable, annual objectives. Schools then determine how to use research-based strategies to achieve these goals, using flexibility as needed. The LSPI development process involves teachers, parents, and community members, so the entire school community has the opportunity to be involved in conversations about school improvement. - **Long Term Goal**

Knight Elementary will have 75% of students as proficient or distinguished learners in English Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System by Spring 2023.

- o **Annual Goal**

Knight Elementary students will demonstrate effective reading comprehension skills by scoring on or above expected levels of performance on GCPS ELA Unit Assessments. 70% of students at each grade level will score at proficient or distinguished as measured by the GCPS ELA Unit Assessment.

- **Long Term Goal**

Knight Elementary will have 75% of students as proficient or distinguished learners in Mathematics and Science on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System by Spring 2023.

- o **Annual Goal**

Knight Elementary students will demonstrate proficiency in mathematical computation skills and problem solving abilities by score on or above their expected levels of performance on the GCPS Math Unit Assessments. 80% of students at each grade level will score at proficient or distinguished as measured by the GCPS Math Unit Assessments.

- **Long Term Goal**

We will build our parents' capacity to support their children's academic achievement by implementing the activities identified in The Plan/The Promise.
