



Mill Creek High School Dual Enrollment Checklist

**2021-2022
School Year**

- Attend a Dual Enrollment (DE) Information Meeting or watch/review the DE Presentation on Mill Creek's website.
- Research! Research! Research!
 - What are the college's admission requirements? No flexibility on these requirements.
 - Where do you plan to go to college after graduation? Will the college accept DE credits? Does the college prefer students take AP courses instead of DE?
 - Are you mature enough to handle the additional responsibilities of a DE student?
- REMEMBER MILL CREEK'S DEADLINES: Fall 2021/Summer 2021 - Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the college by March 15, 2021; Spring 2022 - Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the college by October 15, 2020**
- Complete the 2021-2022 Dual Enrollment Information Google Form: <https://rb.gy/cvu1aw> or use this QR Code 
- Complete the Mill Creek Dual Enrollment Contract and turn it into Mrs. Griffin.
- Take the SAT/ACT/ACCUPLACER (if needed) before Mill Creek's &/or college admission deadlines – send scores to the colleges. Send AP scores to the college as well to exempt intro level courses.
- Both Student and Parent/Guardian completes their portions of the Dual Enrollment Funding Application on GAFutures.org; this is done once a year for each college the student attends.
- Apply and gain acceptance to the college you wish to attend for DE. Students are responsible for following the college's application procedures and meeting all deadlines.
- After receiving your acceptance to the college, schedule an appointment to meet with Mrs. Griffin to plan your Mill Creek and college classes.
 - Part-time Dual Enrollment students will need to plan all college classes around their Mill Creek schedule (course selections and times of their classes). Mill Creek schedule must be finalized by **May 3, 2021**.
- Part-time DE students will need to make all transportation arrangements for their college classes. Parking passes are not guaranteed for DE students and DE students are unable to be on Mill Creek's campus on days/class periods they do not have their college class(s). Students also are unable to remain on MC's campus to complete their online classes as well.
- Register for classes at the college. Follow the college's procedure for registering for classes.
- Turn in a copy of your college schedule to Mrs. Griffin.

Dual Enrollment Students are responsible for completing all high school graduation requirements in order to participate in the graduation ceremony.

The counselor's responsibility is to make sure students meet requirements to GRADUATE from High School. The student's/parent's responsibility is to research what will transfer to which college/major (the counselor can help direct, but cannot speak for a college).

Dual Enrollment College Options & Deadlines

ALL COLLEGE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS below are SUBJECT TO CHANGE!

It is the student's/parent's or guardian's responsibility to verify college admission requirements.

**Mill Creek's Dual Enrollment Deadlines: Fall 2021/Summer 2021 –
Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the college by March 15,
2021; Spring 2022 – Mill Creek's DE Contract due to MCHS & apply to the
college by October 15, 2020
College deadlines could be earlier or later –
but students must meet Mill Creek's deadline to participate.**

Part-time Dual Enrollment students must select college courses around
class times & courses they have selected to take at Mill Creek.
Mill Creek schedule must be finalized by May 3, 2021.

- 11th & 12th Graders Only
- GPA 3.25 Core
- SAT: 530 EBRW and 480 Math; 1050 Total
- ACT: 20 English and 18 Math; Composite 20
- PSAT (if SAT or ACT isn't available): 490 EBRW & 440 Math – 960 total

- 11th & 12th Graders only
- GPA 3.25 Core
- SAT: 500 EBRW and 510 Math
- ACT: 21 English and 20 Math
- ACCUPLACER accepted as well
- Exemption of Test Scores: Completing 2 units of English and have completed Algebra II

- Accepts grades 10th – 12th
- No minimum GPA required – 2.5 is recommended
- Accepts ACCUPLACER Test, SAT/ACT, & PSAT for admission
- If test scores are unavailable, can use HOPE GPA of 2.6 or higher for admission
- 10th graders – DE only covers fees for specific CTAE classes
- 11th & 12th graders – DE Funding covers core courses as well as CTAE courses

- GPA 3.00 Core
- Test Optional

10th Graders:

- GPA 3.00 Core
- SAT: 1200 OR ACT: 26
- Students must meet these test scores to have courses covered by DE; students can pay out-of-pocket they don't meet the required test scores.
